## Learn About a Park

Winter may not be a time when you're clamoring to get outdoors, but maybe it should be. In addition to hiking when the weather's milder, there are plenty of opportunities for other non-traditional winter sports. Some are even cheaper and safer than skiing and snowboarding.

Western Maryland sports three state parks with a plethora of alternative winter activities. Deep Creek Lake and the attached Wisp Ski Resort offer snowtubing and snowshoeing. Most state parks allow snowmobiling with a permit. Green Ridge and New Germany State Parks boast backpacking and hiking trails, with accommodations ranging from primitive sites to cabins.

If you want to try your hand at ice climbing, Swallows Falls State Park and the Savage River Forest have guided tour operators standing by. Ice fisherman also find the getting good at Savage River Reservoir.

For the outdoor experience without the physical effort, Deep Creek offers sleigh rides. Herrington Manor State Park has a sledding hill complete with hot chocolate and a bonfire waiting for you at the bottom.



If you're looking to start out a little closer to the Baltimore/DC Metro area, Gunpowder Falls State Park offers an up to 40 mile one-way cross-country route, ending in York, Pennsylvania. Think outside the house and the box this winter.

## Tip of the Month

Winter can be a great chance to enjoy the outdoors, with the proper precautions. Don't let cold temperatures keep you from exercising and enjoying nature; just try these tips:

As temperatures drop, it might be tempting to curl all the way up into your sleeping bag and cover your entire face. But moisture from your breath can reduce the insulating properties of your sleeping bag by getting it wet, so use a bandanna or stocking cap to keep your face warm.

Even in winter, proper hydration is key - cold winter air is dry and will dehydrate you quickly. Don't grab handfuls of snow to quench your thirst, though, melt it first to avoid lowering your body temperature too much. Warm a small amount of water in your pot to avoid scorching it before the snow starts to melt.

To keep from cooling down too much when hiking, snack on food throughout the day rather than stopping for a long lunch break.

As always, know your limits, and take a friend along.
